1:- Wolverhampton & South Staffordshire Car Club Ltd will organise a Clubman permit autotest **Saturday 25th April 2026.**

2:- The meeting will be governed by the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) these supplementary regulations and any written instructions that the organizing club may issue for the event.

5:- The event is a round of:

The Motorsport UK British Autotest Championship 2026 (permit number CH2026/A001)

The Demon Tweaks Bestfed BTRDA Autotest Championship 2026

The BTRDA Allrounders Championship 2026 (permit number CH2026/Rally023(D))

6:- All competitors must produce a valid Motorsport UK competition licence, championship registration card, and/or club membership card.

7:- The program for the event will be. Scrutineering commences at 8.30 am.

Any competitor not signed on by 09.45 am maybe refused a start. A drivers meeting will be held at 09.50 am by the results hut. The first car will start at 10.00 am.

8:- The event will consist of six classes as follows:

A. Saloon cars under 11ft overall length (inc. Minis with none/original engine and transmission layout driving the front wheels)

B. All other saloon cars

C. Sports cars & sports kit cars.

D. Specials.

E. Road going series production cars and road going kit cars

Cabriolets must run in the appropriate saloon car class with the roof/hood up, or class C or E with the roof/hood down, as appropriate. All lengths refer to the overall length, which will be determined by the Parkers Car Price Guide (January edition of this year).

All vehicles in Class E must comply with Motorsport UK Technical Regulations and be taxed for the public road. A current MOT certificate must be produced at scrutineering: exemption can only be given to vehicles less than three years old and then proof of registration date will be required.

N.B Cabriolets saloons will run in the appropriate saloon car class, or sports/kit car class with hood down.

9:- Awards will be as follows:

Fastest Time of the Day	The Valerie Shaw Memorial Trophy
1st in class (subject to 3 starters)	An award
2nd in class (subject to 6 starters)	An award
3rd in class (subject to 10 starters)	An award
1st novice (subject to 3 starters)	An award

A novice is defined as having not won an award on a Clubmans Autotest or higher.

11:- Provisional results can be checked throughout the day

Any protests must be made in accordance with section 9.1. Otherwise, results will become final 30 minutes after the last competitor finishes the last test.

12:- Details of tests will be sent out with Final Instructions and printed off by the competitor. Drivers will have one run at each test layout.

Timing will be done manually. The starting signal will be "in own time".

The order of attempting tests will be at the organiser's discretion.

13:- Marking of penalties will be as (19.9)

(Wrong test) a maximum penalty of 20 seconds will be imposed when the route around the markers is not followed as shown on the diagram and/or a line is crossed in the incorrect direction. A test will not be incorrect if the driver realises his/her mistake, goes back to the point at which the mistake occurred, and then completes the test correctly as required by the diagram.

The maximum penalty imposed will not exceed the time set by the fastest competitor in that class plus 20 seconds. In the event of there only being one competitor in a class the fastest time set by that competitor on a repeat of the test in question from another round will be used as the base time.

14:- Practicing will NOT be allowed (19.1.2.4)

15:- Competitors will be identified by numbers supplied by the organisers.

16:- All General Regulations of Motorsport UK apply as written except the following, which are modified:

19.1.2.7. Pylons may be less than 1m in height.

19.3.1.2. Vehicles need not be taxed or registered (except for classes E & F), as the event takes place wholly on private property.

19.2.7.4. A vehicle may be entered twice but must be driven by different drivers.

17:- Please make sure that your vehicle is in good mechanical condition and complies with MS UK regulations 19.3. and 7.4. and noise requirements of 7.8.2. and tyre regulations 7.13.

Competitors are reminded that the use of List 1B & 1C tyres is not permitted as per regulation **19.3.1.8.**

18:- In the event of a claim having to be made for damage caused to a third party by a competitor, the organisers of the event reserve the right to reclaim the insurance excess under the Motorsport UK policy (currently £500.00) from the competitor(s) involved.

19:- The club would like to thank the landowners for their kind assistance in the running of this event.

20:- All documentation, wherever possible, will be issued in advance to all competitors and marshals to complete before arriving at the venue.

21:- Sustainability survey: - As you are probably aware in order to comply with current MS UK policy we are required to make a sustainability report. Information regarding your traveling arrangements will be requested at documentation.
